The Stuart Rossiter Memorial Lecture will be held at 5:00 p.m. on Friday 2<sup>nd</sup> November 2012, at the Royal P. S. London The speaker will be Hugh Feldman, the subject "Researching Postal History – the thrills and frustrations" a topic which should interest all Postal Historians. Hugh is well known through his work with ABPS and the PHS.


The paper to be presented is based on two published works of significantly different nature and one in the course of preparation by the speaker.

The first covers the research involved in the writing of the two-volume work Letter Receivers of London 1852 to 1857: A history of their offices and hand stamps within the General, Penny and Twopenny Posts published jointly by the Rossiter Trust and the Postal History Society in 1998. The second is U.S. Contract Mail Routes by Water (Star Routes 1824 – 1875) published by the Collectors Club of Chicago in 2008. The current work under development will also be discussed; this relates to the early contract mails by railroad in the USA.
